#### What is Canva

- Canva is an online design and publishing tool with a mission to empower everyone in the world to design anything and publish anywhere.
- It offers teachers and other users the opportunity to create attractive slideshows, images, videos, quizzes, certificates, infographics, and other media.
- Canva is accessible in eight different languages through most web browsers with the possibility to download mobile IOs or Android app or desktop app for Windows or Mac.

Step 1: Defining the Challenge

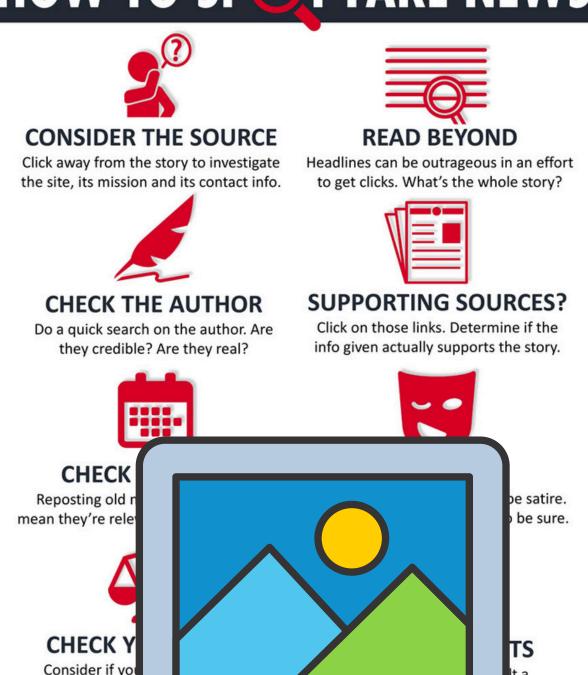

Slide 4: How to Insert Images/Videos in Canv

- 1. Click on 'Uploads' and select 'Upload Files' your device.
- 2. Drag and drop the image onto your canva:
- 3. Use Canva's Elements tab to find stock image
- 4. Resize and position as needed.





#### How to Add a Link to Canva

- 1. Select the text or element where you want to add a link.
- 2. Click on the 'Link' icon in the top menu.
- 3. Enter the URL and press 'Apply'.
- 4. To test the link, switch to Present Mode and click on it.

#### How to Add a PDF to Canva

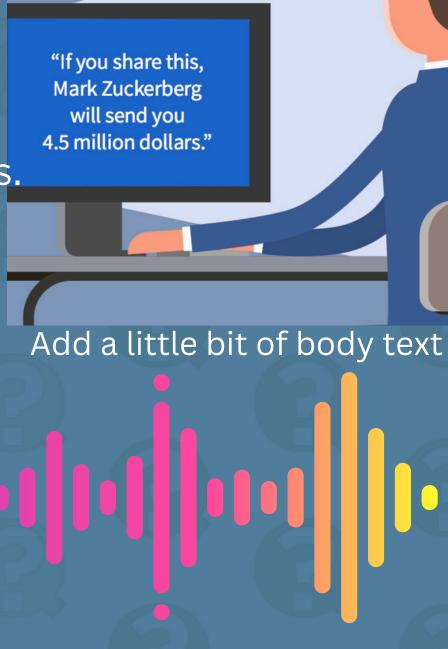
- 1. Click on 'Uploads' in the left-hand toolbar.
- 2. Select 'Upload Files' and choose a PDF from your computer.
- 3. Once uploaded, drag and drop the PDF onto your design canvas.
- 4. Adjust size and position as needed.





How to Add Audio to Canva

- 1. Click on 'Uploads' and upload an audio file.
- 2. Drag the audio file onto the design.
- 3. Adjust the timing and volume in the audio settings.
- 4. Use voiceover recordings to add instructions.



# How to Use Canva? How to Create Infographics Related to Disinformation



- Step 1: Define the purpose of your infographic (e.g., explaining misinformation, countering hoaxes, showing fact-checking steps).
- Step 2: Gather reliable data and sources.
- Step 3: Choose a Canva infographic template.
- Step 4: Add visual elements such as icons, grap and illustrations.
- Step 5: Include concise text with key points.
- Step 6: Customize colors, fonts, and layout for clarity and engagement.
- Step 7: Download and share the infographic.

#### HOW TO SPOT FAKE NEWS



#### CONSIDER THE SOURCE

Click away from the story to investigate the site, its mission and its contact info.



Do a quick search on the author. Are they credible? Are they real?



#### CHECK THE DATE

Reposting old news stories doesn't mean they're relevant to current events.



#### CHECK YOUR BIASES

Consider if your own beliefs could affect your judgement.



Headlines can be outrageous in an effort to get clicks. What's the whole story?



#### SUPPORTING SOURCES?

Click on those links. Determine if the info given actually supports the story.



If it is too outlandish, it might be satire. Research the site and author to be sure.



Ask a librarian, or consult a fact-checking site.



How to Save and Export Your Canva Project

- 1. Click on 'Share' in the top-right corner.
- 2. Choose the format: PDF, PNG, MP4, or GIF.
- 3. Click 'Download' and select quality settings.
- 4. Save to your device or share a link for collaboration.
